

Our ABC class has started. We have 23 students with 8 more on a waiting list. There is defiantly a need for our classes. To coincide with the Seattle

Boat Show, we are going to hold our next class in February again over three Saturdays. Folks seem to like it on Saturday rather than week nights. Thank you Wayne Williamson, Jack Dyer, George Brooks and Bob Miller for teaching that first class session.

With fall and winter weather around the corner, did you know that you can do a pinpoint forecast from NOAA Weather Service? Many times there will be a Small Craft Advisory for the Northern Inland waters (San Juan Islands and surrounding areas). The weather service issues the warnings even if the only area really affected is the southern region (around Smith Island and the Straights of Juan de Fuca). By using a pinpoint forecast, you will see that the middle of Rosario Strait by Obstruction pass, will not have winds or waves large enough to qualify for a Small Craft Advisory. It may take a few clicks to get the map large enough to pinpoint the area you are interested in. Here is the link to NOAA Weather Seattle. <https://www.weather.gov/sew/> You will see a map of the area they are responsible for, then click on the portion of the map you would like a pinpoint forecast for. This is only one place of many to get weather forecasts on the web.

USCG new labels for Life Jackets/Personal Flotation Devices

The US Coast Guard has updated the labels found on life jackets/PFDs to make the labeling easier to understand. New devices will have the new labels, while existing equipment with the old labels are still acceptable. The new labeling scheme also applies to devices manufactured for Canadian boaters.

Executive Officer's Report – John Bellinger for Kelly Libby

- Marketing – Donna Mason
 - Donna and Paul will attempt to repair our canopy themselves after they learned paying someone to repair it is not cost-effective. If it doesn't work, John Bellinger suggested we purchase a new one.

Education Officer - Debbie Richey

- Debbie reported George Brooks has volunteered to teach much of the upcoming ABC class to be held on 3 Saturdays in November. Three students are signed up already.
- Debbie and Bob Miller will take care of refreshments for the class.
- Debbie and Bob Miller will begin looking at having a "Boat Handling" course (formerly "Seamanship") in January 2019.
- Debbie reminded everyone we still need more instructors.

- Assistant Education Officer – Bob Miller

- Bob provided additional ABC class posters to Ex Com and reported the ABC class has been advertised in the local newspapers.
- Bob provided a detailed review of national's information about the new "Boat Handling" course. He mentioned there is likely some significant changes about this course's format and philosophy. It is likely other courses will be revised in this format in the future.
 - To reduce costs and improve efficiency of updates, the course no longer has printed student manuals and is available only via a digital PDF file so it requires a PC or tablet to read.
 - Students may print the PDF themselves if they wish at their own expense (about \$25 for black/white, \$120 at a printing service). The squadron will be provided a set of digital "keys" (valid for 90 days) that will be provided to students with which they can then download the PDF manual.
 - The squadron will be charged the fee for the manual at the time of each download. The keys simply expire after 90 days if unused.
 - Bob has written a "how-to" document to help students with the download process.
 - The course is ADA compliant.
 - The class will be taught in more of a seminar-format, where students can choose to take part in all or only the portions of the course they are interested in without a final exam, or if they want to be certified as an "S" with USPS, they will take the full course and the final exam through their local squadron.
 - Pricing:
 - Our squadron has done well using the following pricing model for the past several years which has been averaging a 25% profit for the squadron:
 - Base rate for courses is \$30 per student.
 - Non-members +100% cost over the materials for courses so \$60, plus an additional \$20 to cover national's fee per non-member which gets them into the USPS University. Total = \$80.

- An additional family member is charged \$20 to SBSPS + the \$20 national fee = \$40.
- We've been charging a 2nd family member enrolled in a class an additional \$20 and this 2nd member + same \$20 to cover national's fee.
- However, now that the new classes won't have a hard copy book involved, Bob suggested we revisit our pricing model, possibly reducing our markup to 75%.

Speaker for November 8 Meeting is Lynn Barre, NOAA, who will address Orca and Boating Safety.

Marine Biologist/Seattle Branch Chief/Southern Resident killer whale recovery coordinator

Lynne has been with the Protected Resources Division in Seattle for fifteen years implementing the Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA) and Endangered Species Act (ESA). Since 2003 she has worked on the endangered listing of the Southern Resident killer whales, designated critical habitat, developed and finalized a Recovery Plan and has implemented actions to conserve and recover the whales, including vessel regulations put in place in 2011. In addition to her work on killer whales, Lynne supports other aspects of the marine mammal program, such as helping coordinate the stranding network.

Lynne also works on ESA-listed rockfish species and coordinates with Puget Sound salmon recovery efforts. Lynne’s background is in marine mammal research including field work in Southern California and Shark Bay, Western Australia studying social behavior, mothers and infants, and genetic relationships of local dolphins. Lynne also worked with the Crittercam team at National Geographic, putting underwater cameras on marine animals to learn about their lives under the surface before joining NOAA first in the Office of Protected Resources in Silver Spring, MD and then on the West Coast. Lynne has a B.S in Biology from Georgetown University and an M.S. in Animal Behavior from San Diego State University.
