

### **A Brief History of our Squadron**

We started from the Everett Squadron as a Provisional Squadron back in 2002. There was deemed a need for teaching boating in northern Snohomish / Western Skagit County after another squadron had changed its demographic. PDC Bruce Troth (D16) had been trying to convince P/C Mark Richey and his wife Debbie to start a new squadron in that area to fill the gap since they lived there. Mark, Debbie, Bruce, P/C Kari Black and Lt. Don Doder agreed to meet for some coffee socials to drum up interest at the Stanwood American Legion. It was there, after several get-togethers, we determined we would try it and applied for provisional status as Skagit-Stilly Provisional Squadron.

The status was approved with the 5 folks above as the bridge and we applied for 100 free ABC books from National to start teaching and get a treasury going. We got the use of Skagit Valley College for classes and were in the catalog. We soon gained enough interest from this to get members as well as transfers from other squadrons and applied for a charter. The name Skagit Bay Sail and Power Squadron was picked from a member contest. It represents the body of water adjacent to most of our demographic. Our charter was approved in April of 2003. Debbie was the first Commander and Mark the first SEO. The rest of the original 5 went back to the squadrons they came from and we drew the rest of the bridge from the remaining new and transfer members.

We moved our meeting place from Stanwood to the Conway Firehall as our membership was mostly centered around the Conway/ Mt. Vernon/Laconner area. We later moved to the Skagit Fairgrounds and then our present location of the Farmhouse restaurant. Our classes are taught many places around the Stanwood, Mt Vernon, and Anacortes area.
