The Educational Department has been busy over the past few weeks. The *Cruising and Cruise Planning (CCP)* course kicked off last week and the forth-coming *Radar for Boaters (RA)* course starting in November already has eight students registered.

Cruising and Cruise Planning Course (CCP)

The CCP course is well underway with 15 students and the in-car final exam is scheduled for October 17 at the Seafarers' Memorial Park parking lot. We have three members from our squadron and two more USPS members from the Friday Harbor squadron. The other 10 are non-members, of which three come from the recent Boat Handling course. Zoom's distance learning capabilities allows us to have students from outside of our physical territory, including San Juan, Whatcom, Snohomish, and King counties. The course is being team-taught by myself, George Brooks, Jack Dyer, and Debbie Richey.

Radar for Boaters Course (RA)

The RA course closes for registration on September 30. It now has eight students, one from the Skagit Bay squadron as well as one from Friday Harbor and two from Poulsbo squadrons. The Squadron Education Officers are sharing announcements of their courses throughout District 16 as more of them become Zoom-enabled.

Radar for Boaters

Classes by Zoom in the Comfort of Your Home

(Laptops/large tablets preferred to view the PowerPoint slides, broadband Internet needed)

Tuesdays and Fridays

November 06, 10, 13, 17, 20, 24, December 05, 2020

The course covers the different types of radar equipment, their capabilities and limitations, as well as their features and how they apply to students' needs. It covers what you need to know about radar, from how and where to mount the antenna to how to interpret the displays, so you can use your radar for collision avoidance and for navigational purposes.

What's Included? For both sail and power boats, *Radar for Boaters* covers a wide range of topics:

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- How radar works – basic concepts,
- What you see on the screen,
- How to control and manage settings,
- Fine tuning of detailed settings,
- Connecting to other nav devices,
- Using radar for blind navigation,
- Review of error conditions and heavy weather,
- Review of Colregs as they apply to radar use.

The course materials include the 240-page *The Radar Book, 2nd Edition* with a 2018 Supplement on the latest technology. It is written by the well-known local author of nautical guides, Kevin Monahan. The course is completed by attending the six two-hour Zoom sessions, followed by an in-automobile final exam. A Certificate of Completion will be awarded.

How Navigation Makes Us Human: Finding North by George Michelsen Foy

Navigation is the key human skill. It's something we do everywhere, whether feeling our way through a bedroom in the dark, or charting a jetliner's flight. But how does navigation affect our brains, our memory, ourselves? Blending scientific research and memoir, and written in beautiful prose, *Finding North* starts with a quest by the author to understand this most basic of human skills--and why it's mortal peril.

Tides: The Science and Spirit of the Ocean by Jonathan White

Writer, sailor, and conservationist Jonathan White hunts for arctic mussels at low tide, races a twenty-five foot tidal bore, investigates tidal power generation, and examines the threats of sea level rise. *Tides* combines lyrical prose with travel adventure and cultural history with scientific inquiry to provide a deep understanding of the forces that keep the earth's water in constant motion.

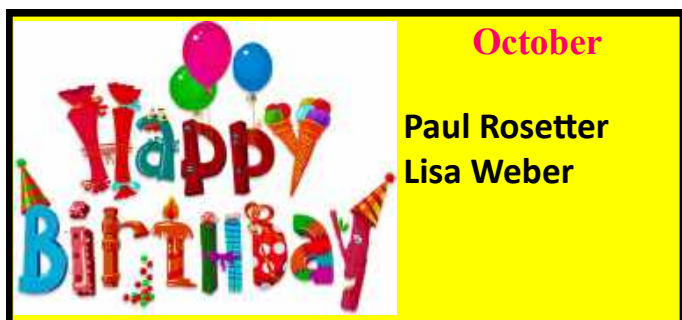
“Tips and Tricks for Anchoring”
