The US Coast Guard-approved America's Boating Course provides you with basic boating knowledge to decide what type and size boat you need, what to do when meeting another boat in a crowded waterway, and how to recognize and handle hazards. Become a more competent boater, learn from the best, and enroll in America's Boating Course today. Many boat insurance companies will offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete America's Boating Course. And, this course provides a sound basis for continuing your recreational boating education.

What's Included? For both sail and power boaters, ABC covers a wide range of topics:

- Types of boats and their uses,
- Boating laws, both Federal and State,
- Safety equipment, both required and recommended,

- Finding your way, and adverse conditions,
- Communications,
- Trailering, knots and lines,
- Water sports topics.

The course materials include a 280 page bound *Student Guide*. The course is completed by taking four 2 ½ hour online sessions with Zoom. The final exam is administered at a location to be determined based on COVID safety comfort level. It will be in Anacortes area. Successful completion of the final exam allows students to apply for their Washington State Boaters Card, required for anyone born after Jan 1, 1955, and operating a vessel with a 15HP motor or greater.

D16 Squadron Commanders and Bridge MeetingSeptember 20, 2021, 6:30 p.m.RE: National Governing Board Meeting and Bylaw Changes

Prior to meeting comment: Friday Harbor is doing blended ABC class (Ken Smith) **Ken Smith, D16 Commander reported National Bylaw changes**: Educational Officer and Assistant Educational Officers no longer need approval from National for these officers. The same goes for Commander and other Bridge officers. This should help the Nominating Committees readying for 2022 nominations. The rational was that your squadron may get an experienced person who could go into Commander before holding other office due to their professional background. This will **stay the same**, if a squadron dissolves, the monies can go to another 503c as directed by the squadron.

Annette Ferguson Finance Committee suggested that National be more financially smart. Annette brought up "\$3.00 processing fee" on our bills. She paid it, but still questioned the fee. (We paid it, too, as well as Ken Smith) It was determined by the Rules Committee as a bylaws violation. Watch for more news on this.

Ken commented that National will end up in the black as they received an infusion in cash from the Educational Fund.

National Marketing News: New initiative "Boat with Confidence" approaches boat manufacturers to help pay/provide classes. Grady White dealer (one of which is in Edmonds, WA) was mentioned. Also, put ABC flyers at boat dealers. West Marine was recently bought by Financial Company (more to come).

Trainer Software for Educational Opportunity: This is the same as virtual trainer but goes on your laptop. It has a gaming platform—gamer orientated. Challenge: It requires a higher level of processor. It should be available after the first of the year at about \$150.
