Here are a few more suggestions for your summer reading entertainment:

<u>Icebound Shipwrecked at the Edge of the World</u> by Andrea Pitzer. For those who haven't yet had enough Shackleton type stories. In 1597 Dutch explorer William Barents and crew set off to the Far Arctic and lost their ship to icebergs. They spent nine months contending with polar bears and endless winter.

<u>The Wager: A Tale of Shipwreck, Mutiny and Murder</u> by David Grann. A page-turner about shipwreck, survival and savagery. This incredible nonfiction survival story is almost too unbelievable to be real.

<u>The D-Day Training Pocket Manual 1944</u> edited by Chris McNab. For history buffs, this brings together excerpts from Allied manuals preparing for D-Day.

<u>The World Encyclopedia of Destroyers and Frigates</u> by Bernard Ireland. This compendium includes more than 500 photographs with quotes from the military men who experienced them.

<u>Hymn To Murder</u> by Paul Doherty. For mystery fans, ships on the Devonshire coast are being deliberately wrecked, crews are slaughtered, cargoes are plundered. Lord Simon is concealing a dark secret and is murdered.

<u>Tales of Al: The Water Rescue Dog</u> by Lynne Cox. Written by an International Swimming Hall of Famer who had to meet a Newfoundland pup trained to jump from a helicopter into Italy's waters and the other dogs of the Italian School of Rescue Dobs.

<u>The Book of Sea Shanties Wellerman and Other Songs from the Seven Seas</u> by Nathan Evans. Scottish singer Nathan Evans, during Covid lockdown, posted performances on the internet and has published a collection of sea shanty lyrics and meaningful notes.

For readers 9-12: <u>Northwind</u> by Gary Paulsen. A deadly plague reaches a fishing camp and orphan Leif flees in a cedar canoe and is thrown from one danger to another.

A lullaby for children up to Age 7: <u>Ocean Lullaby</u>. By Laura McGee Kvasnosky. A family relaxes on a tropical beach while sea creatures get ready to rest. Accompanied by pastel pictures.

For Ages 5-9: <u>Find Me Adventures in the Ocean</u> by Agnese Baruzzi. Joining other "Find Me Adventures," this search and find version dives beneath the surface of the deep blue sea.

For readers 9-12: <u>The Deep Blue Explore Earth's Majestic Oceans</u> by Charlotte Guillain. Explore ocean landscapes, learn about ecosystems and a range of species, with exquisite paintings.

For Ages 7 and Up: <u>The Complete Laugh-Out-Loud Jokes for Kids</u> by Rob Elliott. Here's one for parents or grandparents entertaining kids. Youngsters will delight in the collection of family-friendly gut busters.
