## BOAT SHOW

Hello Skagit Bay Members,

Happy 2013 everyone! I hope this new year finds all of you healthy and in good spirits. Our January 10th meeting is approaching and it's our annual rendezvous/event planning session. Donna and Paul always make this a particularly fun meeting so I hope you plan to join us at the Farmhouse on the 10th at our usual time with social beginning at 6:00 pm, meeting at 6:30, dinner at 7:00, and then our 2013 event planning begins!

Regarding the boat show, we have recently received information about staffing the USPS booth at the 2013 Seattle Boat Show from Nick Ledbetter, the District 16 Boat Show Coordinator. The folks in charge are definitely changing things up this year and they have set **multiple new requirements for booth volunteers**. In addition to adding "Booth Captains", made up of district committee members, they've increased the length of the shifts. Therefore, they won't be needing as many volunteers as they have in the past.

To cover a boat show day, our squadron would need to have 2-5 people signed up. I have not requested a particular date for our squadron to sign up for at this point, because I'm unsure of how many of our folks will be interested, given the new requirements. District folks have assured me that we are not required to fill time slots, so please don't feel obligated. Even if we don't get enough volunteers to cover a booth for a day, we could always coordinate a day for our members to attend the boat show and still meet for the usual dinner afterwards,

as we've done in the past. Let me know if you're interested in this option.

If you're still interested in working the booth, please review the information below and get back to me as soon as possible. If we get enough volunteers who meet the requirements, I can work with you to schedule a date with the boat show coordinator. We need to move on this quickly since the boat show is only 3 weeks away. It runs Jan 25 - Feb. 3, and many of the week 2 dates are already covered, so we'd likely be looking at one of the days between Jan 25 - Jan 29.

### New Boat Show Booth Information/Requirements

1. Be outgoing, cheerful, and willing to draw boat show visitors into our booth area and promote registration and participation into USPS programs and events.
2. Be willing to contribute 3 - 3.5 hours of booth time.
3. Have engaging presentation skills and enthusiasm as demonstrated through being a Certified Instructor, a Bridge Officer, or Committee leadership. (Outside work experience qualifies too)
4. Have recently taken and can enthusiastically speak about a course or courses you have taken.
5. Be aware of and able to discuss most of if not all USPS courses, seminars and "On The Water" programs.
6. Attend a 1-2 hour "Boat Show Staff Training" session (in-person or via webinar).

### FAQs

**What is the staff Dress Code?**: a USPS polo shirt (no color preference), preferably one with the new 100 year logo (available for ~\$35 at <http://www.shopusps.org/product1263.html>) USPS offers 2 week shipping, or you can call Customer Service for expedited delivery. If you don't want to buy a new one, wear the polo shirt that you probably have, but no uniforms this year! We are going for the less formal, FUN look!



**Who Was Joe Friday?**

Friday Harbor, WA

Friday Harbor was named for a Kanaka - a Hawaiian named Joseph Poalie Friday, who was employed by the Hudson's Bay Company to tend sheep on the land overlooking the harbor. His dwelling was the only one to be seen for miles and when sailors coming along the coast saw the smoke from his camp, they knew they had reached "Friday's Harbor."

The first reference to Joe Friday appears in 1841 when he worked for the Hudson's Bay Company on Cowlitz Farm, located on the Cowlitz River about halfway between the Columbia River and Puget Sound. He was employed as a general laborer or mid-man, which is the Hawaiian term for the paddler in the middle of a canoe. He was probably in his late teens or early 20s.

At that time in the Hawaiian Islands, jobs were scarce and commoners could not hold land. Therefore the Hudson's Bay Company found it very easy to recruit strong young men, excellent fishermen and sailors, to work for them in the Pacific Northwest. Hudson's Bay Company records show that Friday's wage was 30 pounds a year. After working at Cowlitz for a year he was transferred to newly established Fort Victoria, then later San Juan Island.

By the time the Pig War ended and the San Juan Islands were awarded to the United States, the Hudson's Bay Company had given up its operations here. In 1872 many of the British on the island, fearful for their rights, drew up a petition asking that Captain Delacomb, a British officer, be sent to watch over their affairs. Joseph Friday's signature is among the 60 signatures on this document.
