A recent example of how boaters come to the aid of those in distress was on Friday morning, September 30. With only ¼-mile visibility, a Kenmore Air plane from Lake Union en route to Roche Harbor crashed in 9 feet of water off the south end of

Lopez Island. The nearby crew of the vessel "Northern Rose" placed a May Day call and then rescued the four occupants, three men and one woman. The plane occupants were wearing life jackets, were treated for hypothermia and minor cuts, and luckily had no life-threatening injuries. (Seattle Times)

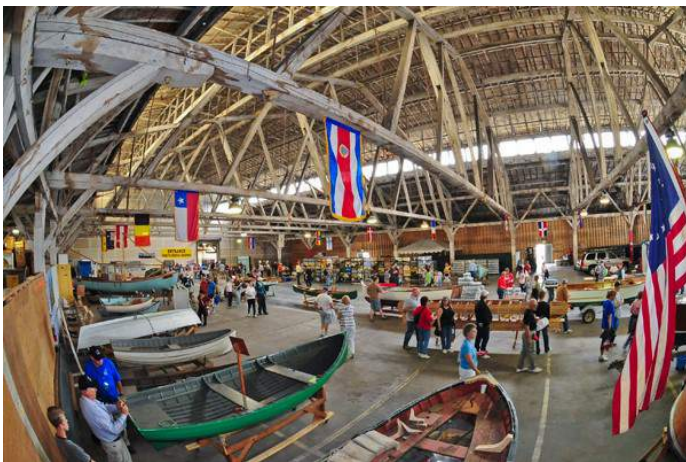

Our summer boating season has come to an end. **But wait! There's more!**

Saturday, November 5 Train day trip to Tacoma Foss Waterway Seaport Museum. This will involve a little walking and local public transportation in Tacoma.

Amtrak Cascades train #513 leaves Mt. Vernon station at 9:02 a.m. and arrives in Tacoma at 11:58 a.m. We'll walk a block or two to get public transportation to a restaurant, possibly Rock The Dock Pub & Grill, for a group lunch near the museum. You can order lunch from the menu. At 2 p.m. we'll have a docent-led tour of the Foss Waterway Working Waterfront Maritime Museum



(www.fosswaterwayseaport.org). Museum group tours, of 10 or more people, cost \$8 Adults, \$6 Senior. We'll take public transportation back to the train station where we'll return on the Amtrak Cascades #516 at 5:24 p.m. train to Mt. Vernon, arriving at 8:27 p.m. Check Amtrak.com for rates and discounts. Buy your own train tickets. As of 10/2/16, the Saver Fare was \$40 per person round trip. Those fares are available until used up, so get your tickets as early as possible. You usually get the best rates buying tickets 2 weeks in advance. Check their website, www.Amtrak.com, for possible promotional rates. If you have complicated questions, call 1-800 872-7245 and request "Agent," so you can talk to a human. I scheduled this early November, before the heavy rains might cause train delays, but we have to be flexible with delays. So far 13 people have indicated interest in this trip.

Saturday December 10: SBSPS Holiday Party. Space is reserved for us at the LaConner Pub for the Lighted Boat Parade and dinner party. Festivities begin at 5 p.m. You can order from the menu; we provide dessert. Enjoy the lighted boat parade viewable from the restaurant.

Meeting called to order by Commander Donna Mason at 1900. A quorum of the Executive Committee was present.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Executive Officer Report – Debbie Richey for Mark Richey
Nothing new to report.

Liaison Officer Report – Debbie Richey:
Sooke and Juan de Fuca Canadian Power Squadrons have folded. The Vancouver Island North and South districts are merging to the Vancouver Island District.

Co-Op Charting – Donna Mason for Lynn Stewart

Public Relations – Kari Randall-Secrest for Deanna Randall-Secrest

Squadron Educational Officer – Debbie Richey:

Debbie and Instructor Bob Miller are planning an upcoming Advanced Piloting course.

Debbie is looking for a room for an all-day Saturday ABC course this fall, taught by Debbie and Mark Richey.

There are plans for a second ABC course to begin in January at Anacortes Marina, taught by Mike Wytchak.

Debbie is planning an upcoming Operations Training course.

Discussion regarding squadron course fees:

Debbie suggested we set prices for our courses based on what we've done for some recent courses, which will make advertising easier.

In the past, we haven't always charged enough for our courses to cover the instructor's materials.

Recently, for our squadron's last Piloting course, we charged members \$100 for a single and \$125 for two folks sharing the book/materials and \$175 for a single non-member and \$200 for two non-members sharing the book/materials. This went very well and the class was full (about ½ the class were non-members) and there was even a waiting list to get into the class.

For ABC, our squadron typically likes to keep the cost a bit lower cost at \$55 for a single and \$65 for a couple sharing materials.

There was also discussion regarding shipping of materials and course exams to/from national.

Donna initiated further discussion regarding how we should handle pricing for a non-member agency requesting a class, such as a local fire department. The Burlington Fire Department, for example, has requested we teach an ABC course next spring. Debbie is working on this with them. After discussion, the consensus was to keep it simple with just two pricing plans, one for members and one non-members.

Debbie made a motion that we charge cost + 20% markup for members, and cost + %100 markup for non-members for our advanced course fees. Kari seconded the motion.

The motion carried.

Administrative Officer Report – Dick Hunter:

Program Tonight: Dick Hunter announced Isaac Oczkewicz of La Conner Maritime will talk about boat maintenance.

October program will be presented by our own Bob Miller.

November program will be a speaker from the Coast Guard Sector Bellingham about preparing for and dealing with a Coast Guard boarding.
