#### Sea Music By Soon-to-be-past-commander Donna

Need some music to get you in the mood for a cruise? Need a break from sea shanties? How about some classical sea music? Beginning with Vivaldi's "La tempesta di mere" (The Storm at Sea) in the 1720's to John Luther Adams' "Become Ocean" which won the Pulitzer Prize for music in 2014, there are many pieces from which to choose.

As Seattle Symphony Music Director Ludovic Merlot has written, "The rise and fall of waves finds parallel in the rising and falling pitch of melodic lines. The varied movement of water produces rhythms that music readily can represent."

Other examples are Mendelssohn's "Hebrides" Overture with its own sea storm and Debussy's symphonic seascape "La mer." Sibelius' 1914 "The Oceanides" portrays not only the ocean's rolling waves, sprays of foam and wind whipping up large swells, but also water nymphs. One music critic said it was "the finest evocation of the sea ever produced in music." Benjamin Britten's "Four Sea Interludes" from his opera "Peter Grimes" includes a storm at sea and an impression of the shore. I recently experienced it being performed at Seattle Symphony, which included 2 sets of kettle drums, 5 French horns and 7 members of the brass section. It is a storm I never would want to be in!

Some amazing sea music I remember from "The Onedin Line" is the Adagio of Spartacus which evokes tall ships on the high seas, and "Phaygia," the original 1975's Poldark TV series theme written by Kenyon Emreys-Roberts. As a child with my Father, I watched the "Victory at Sea" series on TV.

So, if you are making a boating video and need some background music, you now have a head start!

- Vessel Safety Examinations Report by Don Coleman
  - On had received a question recently inquiring whether or not you need to wear a PFD during a vessel safety examination? Don stated years ago, it was true you could receive credit for wearing your PFD during your exam, but stated this rule is no longer true and you do not need to wear your PFD during a vessel safety exam.
  - On also recommended now is a good time to pull out your PFD and blow it up manually, make sure it holds air and also check your cylinder is in working order if your PFD has one. This should be done annually.
  - Regarding the question of whether or not the USCG will approve use of the SOS 1001 strobe light kit on the market (only approved for nighttime distress signaling and advertised that it is good for life) as your only source of distress signaling as long as its paired with an approved daytime signaling device and the answer is... yes! However, Don urged caution and reminded everyone to consider whether or not you really want your daytime signaling device to be your only source of distress signaling during daylight.
  - O Don confirmed Donna can post a sign at our tulip festival booth advertising him for VSCs.

# **VE Notes: April**

Using inflatable PFD during freezing temperatures: Hopefully, this is something we will not soon worry about. But it did come up during the last meeting. So why worry about outside temperature when using an inflatable?

It's all about air volume. We all know what happens to air molecules when cooled. Thus, when an inflatable PFD inflates at freezing temperatures, a fully charged CO2 cylinder might not completely inflate the air chambers. The 22 lbs. of buoyancy you were expecting is now something less. If the unthinkable happens and you find yourself overboard on a really cold day you might find yourself bobbing around trying to keep your nose above water. You get the picture!

Some manufactures warn users to not use their inflatables when temperatures are below freezing. Others warn users to partially inflate the vest manually. Such warnings are included in the printed instructions on the PFD; another great reminder to read those instructions.

**Recalled Kidde Smoke Alarms:** March 21, 2018: Kidde is recalling 500,000 smoke alarms models P12010 and P19010 dated between Sept. 10, 2016 and Oct. 13, 2017. Some of these might have found their way to your home or perhaps your boat. More VE's needed: This is a good time of year to become qualified. There will be many opportunities this spring and summer to perform vessel inspections. The VE manual is available on the USPS website, in the Vessel Safety Check section. Once you have completed the open book test I will be available to help get you through the five required supervised inspections for final qualification. To remain qualified you need do only five inspections annually. Please contact me if interested.
