### Commanders Message Cdr. John Bellinger, SN



Executive Officer's Report – John Bellinger for Kelly Libby

- Boat Show - John announced the Seattle Boat Show is Jan 25- Feb 2, George Brooks reminded folks the Seattle viaduct will create traffic issue, Bob Miller suggested Amtrak might be the best option for folks.
  - Donna Mason announced for those interested in boat show booth duty, you must sign up on D16 web-site for a specific date/time. She also stated the boat simulator will be present at USPS booth.
- Marketing – Donna Mason
  - Rack cards – Donna is working on rack cards since each squadron is supposed to have squadron literature present at the boat show booth. Still believe that the current location of the magnetic north pole is somewhere above Hudson Bay in Canada? Contrary to what the older USPS courses show, the current magnetic pole has crossed the international date line and has moved into Siberia. This abstract from LiveScience.com explains that the Magnetic North Pole is moving rapidly.

"News of the magnetic north's meanderings isn't exactly new. Researchers figured out in the 1800s that magnetic north tended to drift. Then, in the mid-1990s, it began moving faster, from just over 9 miles (15 kilometers) a year to about 34 miles (55 km) annually, Nature reported. In 2018, magnetic north skipped over the International Date Line and entered the Eastern Hemisphere."

Now, what is the difference between the magnetic north pole and the geomagnetic north pole? The former is the actual place a magnetic compass will point and is sometimes called the magnetic dip pole, where a compass will point down. The latter is a theoretical location where a magnetic dipole would show. The geomagnetic north and south poles are antipodal points, meaning that that a line between them would bisect the center of the earth. Lucky for me, they happened to take a cellphone selfie, so I was able to get the GPS coordinates of the event. I created a design and charted it on 12/inch graph paper, then used algebra to determine the correct size of the 14/inch needlepoint canvas. Yes, one can use algebra these days!

More math: it took 2 ½ busy months to do the 66,885 stitches, in Washington State Ferry colors, to complete the pillow front measuring 23" x 15". A local upholsterer completed the job. A pocket in the green velvet back holds a photo of the couple taken when I learned of the engagement as well as a Google screen shot of the exact location of the proposal along the ferry route. It was a nautical way to document this romantic occasion. The bride-to-be is a member of another USPS® squadron.



By the way, the GPS coordinates plugged into the screen shot verified that the ferry captain was exactly on course.
