Squadron Activities 2020 By P/C Donna Mason, AP

Thanks to the SBSPS members who joined in the Planning Meeting January 9, we have a great lineup of activities for 2020. There's something for everyone, from saltwater to freshwater and land. This is my 12th year as Activities Chair (anyone else want this job?), and I appreciate everyone's participation.

March 28 - Steveston, B.C. Canada Day Trip

We'll cross the border by car and enjoy a day in the sunniest town in Canada. Carpooling recommended. We'll begin with a guided tour of the Gulf of Georgia Cannery National Historic Site which was built in 1894 over the saltwater, we'll enjoy an interactive museum of the fishing and canning industry on Canada's West Coast. If we have a minimum of 10 people, the cost is \$C6.60 per person. Otherwise, Adults \$C11.90, Seniors \$C10.20, Youth 17 and under are free. Dress in warm layers for this tour. There is free parking behind the museum. After the 1½ hour tour, we'll enjoy a group lunch. After lunch you'll have time to explore around town, walk to the shoreline Britannia Shipyards National Historic Site or to Fisherman's Wharf.

April 17-19 - Mount Vernon Tulip Festival Street Fair Booth

Our squadron will have a booth at this popular 3-day street fair with over 150 artisan booths. Depending on the weather 15,000-40,000 people stroll through this fair. We'll need volunteers to set up on April 17, do a couple hours of booth duty, and take down the booth Sunday afternoon. This gives us the opportunity for thousands of people to learn about SBSPS, USPS and safe boating.

<u>April 25 – Friday Harbor Ferry Day Trip</u>

We'll walk on the ferry and spend the day at Friday Harbor, exploring at your leisure, then we'll meet for an early dinner near the ferry landing before heading back home, perhaps with an ice cream cone in hand. We usually enjoy nice weather in Friday Harbor.

May 9 – D16 Educational Seminar, Anacortes

This year our squadron will host the D16 Educational Seminar. Bob Miller and Sandy Johnson have this project well under control already. We'll need some volunteers to help throughout the day.

May 29-31 – Lake Chelan Weekend Rendezvous



Skagit Bay and Deception Pass Joint Rendezvous in Sidney, BC 26-28 June 2020

Where: Sidney, BC, AKA "Sidney by the Sea", http://www.sidney.ca/

Head over to Vancouver Island, BC, and join Deception Pass and Skagit Bay members as we visit nearby Sidney on (with luck) a nice Summer weekend. This is a walk-on ferry rendezvous for those who are not taking their boats to the Port Sidney Marina downtown.

The Town of Sidney (sometimes called Sidney-by-the-Sea or the 'Book Store Village') is a great place to spend the weekend, with plenty of good restaurants, nice galleries, and lots of chocolate and tea shops as well as good breweries and distilleries. Bob always says "Chocolate is one of the basic food groups."

Planned Activities: A dynamic, on-site, group-participation process; this is a way kicked-back rendezvous. Just wander along the streets and waterfront, get some exercise, do some shopping, eat some stuff, and take it easy. On Friday night, we can join up at a local pub to get to know each other and on Saturday night we will go to a restaurant for a group dinner. Other proposed group activities include:

Saturday afternoon, taste and learn how gin, vodka, and bitters are made at the Victoria Distillers shoreside distillery, paid tours and tastings - https://victoriadistillers.com/tours-tastings/, 9891 Seaport Place.

Saturday evening, dinner, Odyssia Restaurant, Greek and continental good food, http://www.odyssiasteakhouse.com/ index.html, 9785 Fifth St, Sidney.

Sunday Brunch, place to be determined by group.

How to Get There --

By Boat: Sidney is about 35 nautical miles from Cap Sante in Anacortes and less than 20 miles from Friday Harbor. If leaving from Anacortes, turn left out of Padilla Bay into Guemes Channel and just head west until you run into Vancouver Island. You may have to dodge some islands and large white and green ferry boats, but the cruise is protected and scenic. Look for the orca pods and other wild life.

By Ferry: The early Anacortes-Sidney Washington State ferry leaves Anacortes at 08:30 am and arrives in Sidney by 11:10 am, with a stop in Friday Harbor (departs Friday Harbor at 09:55 am). On Sunday, catch the later 05:55 pm ferry to arrive back in Friday Harbor at 07:25 pm and Anacortes by 08:30 pm. Note this is the Summer schedule, effective 31 March to 22 June 2019.

Moorage in Sidney: the Port Sydney Marina has slips available. Make your own reservations, http://www.portsidney.com/.

Lodging in Sidney: For those coming by ferry, there are several hotels within walking distance of the ferry terminal and the marina, http://www.ehcanadatravel.com/british-columbia/vancouver-island/sidney.html. Also, check US-based hotel reservation sites for special pre-paid rates. Book early because late June is busy.

Passports and Border Control: US Passports are required to get back into the USA and facilitate entry into Canada. Standard WA Drivers Licenses are not adequate identification. Ferry riders are checked as they exit in Sidney, and in Friday Harbor. Boaters tie up to the customs dock in the turning basin at the marina and use the direct line phone on the dock for clearance. Returning to the USA, boaters can phone US Customs and Border Protection while underway at 800-562-5943.


