It is time for my annual boating/water-related Holiday book gift suggestions:

The Raven and the Banshee, in early 1856 C Charleston, SC a shipping family embarks to chart a new shipping route to the Caribbean. A passionate tale of vengeance, forgiveness, and redemption in a rollicking, swashbuckling adventure on the high seas.

Mutiny on the Rising Sun: A Tragic Tale of Slavery, Smuggling, and Chocolate shows how the illegal trade created demand for exotic products and how slavery and smuggling were integral to the development of American capitalism.

Waters of the World: The Story of the Scientists Who Unraveled the Mysteries of Our Oceans, Atmosphere, and Ice Sheets and Made the Planet Whole shows how scientists who summited volcanoes, cored mile-thick ice sheets and flew inside storm clouds to understand our Earth's atmosphere and climate.

The Weather of the Pacific Northwest: 2nd Edition explains the complex interaction of atmosphere and topography in the Pacific Northwest.

Cascadia Revealed: A Guide to the Plants, Animals, and Geology of the Pacific Northwest Mountains, a field guide to explain about all those things you see from your boat as you cruise through the Pacific Northwest.

Adrift, one of the three in the "Strong Heart" series, follows salvagers intent on claiming the remains of a burned-out cargo ship in the Gulf of Alaska.

Underwater Wild: My Octopus Teacher's Extraordinary World, by the makers of documentary film "My Octopus Teacher" covers new ocean biology research with breathtaking photographs. The Alaska Heritage Seafood Cookbook includes fascinating tidbits of Alaska history and lore.

For young readers: Viking in Love, a laugh out loud picture book about a Viking facing his fear of the sea.

Inside My Sea of Dreams: The Adventures of Kami and Suz, a seafaring adventure to Alaska, a little girl's big adventure in a tiny kayak.

(Minutes taken by Donna Mason in Sec'y Debbie Richey's absence)

The meeting was called to order by Cdr Carolyn Caporgno at 1834 hours. After a non-flag salute, officer's reports were given.

Marketing: Donna Mason announced there are three downloadable, print-at-home brochures (ABC, Membership and Education) and a flyer about the Free ABC Mobile App easily obtainable at USPS' MarCom (Marketing Communications webpage). You don't need to sign in with your member number. Anyone can print these at home should the need or opportunity arise to encourage a new person to take a class, learn about ABC, etc. We discussed boat dealerships as a next marketing opportunity phase.

Education: Carolyn reported that Mark Richey's class flyer is in the November "Bitter End". She recommended adding a class planning session along with our activities planning at the January General Meeting. Shelter Bay may be interested in our class and seminar offerings. Three members meet regularly with the yacht club incoming commodore and will talk with him about our offerings. Carolyn is pursuing being a speaker at one of the Shelter Bay meetings.

Administrative Officer: Carolyn reported we still need an AO and there are slots open for speakers, especially next March.

Squadron Activities: Donna reported that we have 24 spaces for the Holiday Party and Lighted Boat Parade at LaConner Pub, Saturday, December 11 beginning at 5 p.m. Our squadron has the entire covered outdoor patio which has plastic sheet wind protection and heaters. A sign-up sheet was passed around, and she will send an email to members. She also encouraged members to think of activities they'd like to do in 2022 and offer them at the January Activities Planning Meeting.

(There was a temporary adjournment for dinner from 1848 to 1908 hours.)

Secretary: Carolyn filled in for Debbie Richey. The minutes of the October 14 General Meeting were approved with a correction to the starting time.

Treasurer: Jack Dyer reported there is a checking account balance of \$4xxxx as the end of October. Expenses so far for November are \$4 bank fee and \$68 storage fee. There was discussion about getting a checking account without fees.

Commander Carolyn suggested pursuing a partnership with Shelter Bay Yacht Club (covered above)

Old Business: The National Treasurer's Report is on the website.

George Brooks took the Instructor Requalification via Zoom. Jim West ran an excellent class. The USPS Zoom permit ends the end of December and National USPS will have to renew it. Could be a problem for Mark's planned January class if there are delays.

New Business: Woody Woodward offered that the recent D16 Marina Hop was a success, and it should be offered every year.

USPS America's Boating Course

Exam In-Person Location TBD: Saturday, January 22, 1PM

The US Coast Guard-approved *America's Boating Course* provides you with basic boating knowledge to decide what type and size boat you need, what to do when meeting another boat in a crowded waterway, and how to recognize and handle hazards. Become a more competent boater, learn from the best, and enroll in *America's Boating Course* today. Many boat insurance companies will offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete *America's Boating Course*. And, this course provides a sound basis for continuing your recreational boating education.

What's Included? For both sail and power boaters, *ABC* covers a wide range of topics:

- Types of boats and their uses,
- Boating laws, both Federal and State,
- Safety equipment, both required and recommended,
- Finding your way, and adverse conditions,
- Communications,
- Trailering, knots and lines,
- Water sports topics.

The course materials include a 280 page bound *Student Guide*. The course is completed by taking two, 5 hour, online sessions with Zoom. The final exam is administered at a location to be determined based on COVID safety comfort level. It will be in Anacortes area. Successful completion of the final exam allows students to apply for their Washington State Boaters Card, required for anyone born after Jan 1, 1955, and operating a vessel with a 15HP motor or greater.
