
Hello Boating Friends,

- 1) RSVP to Donna via donnaimason@gmail.com for last minute coordination and restaurant reservations.
- 2) Reserve HOTEL 2 nights Thursday, Dec. 14 and Friday, Dec. 15: Make your hotel reservation on your own. Suggest near Burrard Sky Train. Paul and I are reserved at Executive Hotel Le Soleil, 567 Hornby St. close to the Sky Train and bus lines. It was the best TOTAL WITH FEES rate for the hotels in my target area. Some other nearby hotels are Pinnacle Harbor Front, Vancouver Marriott Pinnacle, Exchange Hotel Vancouver; cheapest = Days Inn. Check for discounts such as AAA. Pay attention to USD rate vs. Canada dollar rate and total price with all fees.
- 2) Buy your Amtrak round trip tickets at https://www.amtrakcascades.com from Mount Vernon to Vancouver B.C. Canada Thursday, December 14 departing 9:24 a.m., and returning Saturday, December 16, from Vancouver, BC Canada to Mount Vernon departing at 5:45 p.m. As of October 10, round trip cost for 2 seniors is US\$88. Buy online at Amtrak or the Bellingham station has a ticket agent.

3) Bring your Passport.

- 4) Buy your tickets on line for the "Vancouver Holiday Dinner and Carols Cruise" Thursday, December 14 at 6:30 p.m. boarding for 7:00 p.m. departure, a 2 ½ hour full buffet dinner cruise with live carolers, cruising through False Creek, North and West Vancouver or Deep Cove, with decorated boats on parade. It only operates on Sunday, Wednesday, and Thursday.
 - OPTION 1: Direct with Harbor Cruises (boatcruises.com gets you to Vancouver's Harbor Cruises website.) Can\$197.00 total = US\$144.85 per person) Includes taxes and gratuities. Alcoholic drinks extra. <u>Tell them to seat you with "Donna Mason</u>." [https://boatcruises.com, or call 1 (800) 663-1500 or (604) 688-7246].
 - <u>OPTION 2</u>: Trip Advisor/Viator advertises a cheaper rate of US\$92.00, but they can only sell 10 tickets per cruise at that price. If you buy your ticket from them, follow up by calling the Harbor Cruises number in Option 1 to ask them to seat you with "Donna Mason".

Boat trip tickets are non-refundable and non-transferrable. Vessel & routing subject to change due to inclement weather for your safety and comfort.

5) November 1: Order tickets at vandeusengarden.org, December 15 Festival of Lights. Final information is not available until November 1. Cost TBA: estimated Can\$20-25 for senior—adults. Order early; tickets sell out.
