The cruise leaves from Kirkland City Dock, boarding at 1:30 p.m. Order your tickets directly online at https://www.argosycruises.com/argosy-cruises/christmas-ship-festival. Specify "The Christmas Ship" Spirit of Seattle (not the follow boat) when ordering your tickets for the 2 p.m. departure. Posted prices: Adult 13-64 \$54, Senior \$50, Youth 4-12 \$40. There is no AAA discount, and they add processing fees.

Many options available, including the Peter Kirk Municipal Parking Garage (under the Kirkland Library), the Lakeshore Plaza lot, and City Hall (free nights and weekends). Are you tearing your hair out trying to find a gift for a boating relative or friend? Here are some suggestions to help you:

Relative to Wind: On Sailing, Craft, and Community by Phoebe Wang. A poetic rendering of her decade-long journey learning to sail, working with crew in tempestuous conditions and racing.

River Songs: Moments of Wild Wonder in fly Fishing by Steve Duda, a rock-and-roll fly fisher. His work in film, publishing and live appearances for over three decades provides thought-provoking collection of stories.

Beyond the Wonder: an Ecologist's View of Wild Alaska by Thomas Bancroft. An exploration of two of Alaska's national parks, with roaming bears, migrating sockeyes, and numerous birds.

Playground by Richard Powers. Pulitzer prize-winning author of The overstory, has a new novel set in the world's largest ocean and one of the last truly wild places on earth.

If the Shoe Fits: The Adventures of the Reluctant Boat Frau by Rae Ellen Lee (also available at Allied Arts Holiday Sale, 1131 Commercial St., Bellingham). The ups and downs of life aboard, taking risks and making changes.

A History of the World in Twelve Shipwrecks by David Gibbins. Renowned maritime archeologist ties together the stories of some of the most significant shipwrecks in time to form a single overarching narrative of world history.

Three Sheets to the Wind: The Nautical Origins of Everyday Expressions by Cynthia Barrett. An entertaining compilation revealing the maritime roots of common English expressions
