November 15-17 Train trip to Vancouver, B.C. Canada - By 9:30 a.m., we'll meet at the Mount Vernon Amtrak station, where there is plenty of free parking. Don't forget your passports! We'll hop on <u>Train 516 departing at 10:04 a.m.</u> arriving in Vancouver B.C. Canada at 12:30 p.m. The latest quote for 2 seniors Coach is \$85 total. We'll clear customs then head for our hotels, probably via Uber or Lyft. Hungry people may want to grab a snack at the station. After settling in our rooms, we could go out for a group lunch or explore on our own. At time of writing, it is too soon to know what is happening in Vancouver that weekend, but it always is an entertaining city! So far two couples are going and are staying at <u>The Sylvia Hotel on English Bay at 1154 Gilford St.</u> It is a 3-star hotel with a 4.3/5 rating. Friends have recommended this to me, and it gets good reviews. They offer several room options. We will explore the English Bay area, enjoy neighborhood restaurants, and discover what's happening at that time. The exchange rate at time of writing is \$1US = \$1.39CA.

<u>December 14 is our Squadron Holiday Party and LaConner Lighted Boat Parade</u> at the LaConner Pub, beginning at 5 p.m. We'll partake in revelry and order dinner from the menu. We'll enjoy squadron-provided chocolate cake for dessert. You can voluntarily contribute to local Neighbors-in-Need Food Bank. We recommend arriving in LaConner early to get a parking space and explore the shops or stroll along the river walkway. We have restaurant space for 20 people; reserve your space by December 4. So far we have 12 people signed up!

<u>December 21 Argosy Christmas Caroling Ship from the Kirkland City Dock from 2-3:30 p.m.</u> The *Spirit of Seattle*™, the Official Christmas Ship™, is decorated with hundreds of shimmery white lights and sails to different Puget Sound waterfront communities. The "Naughty and Nice" Choir on board will entertain us.

We'll meet at 11:00 a.m. at Cactus Restaurant, 121 Park Lane in Kirkland, for lunch prior to the cruise which leaves from Kirkland City Dock, boarding at 1:30 p.m. Order your tickets directly online at https://www.argosycruises.com/argosy-cruises/christmas-ship-festival. Specify "The Christmas Ship" Spirit of Seattle (not the follow boat) when ordering your tickets for the 2 p.m. departure. Posted prices: Adult 13-64 \$54, Senior \$50, Youth 4-12 \$40. There is no AAA discount, and they add processing fees.

Parking: Argosy recommends giving extra time if you plan to park in a downtown Kirkland lot or garage. Many options available, including the Peter Kirk Municipal Parking Garage (under the Kirkland Library), the Lakeshore Plaza lot, and City Hall (free nights and weekends). You can also visit the City of Kirkland Parking Guide or Parkopedia for additional Kirkland parking options.
